## \*Adjustment for HEALTH CARE COSTS

BE IT RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$113,614. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums.

## \*Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement 2025-2026

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$8,000.00 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$972.00 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000.00 for the 2025-2026 School Year.
