C. 2025-2026 BUDGET- \*Pending Department of Education approval of tax levy increase application.

1. FINAL Budget Adoption – with all other resolutions re-adopted

Adoption of the FINAL BUDGET, with modifications to the TENTATIVE BUDGET approved by the Executive County Superintendent

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education adopted a TENTATIVE budget on March 13, 2025, and submitted it to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval, and

WHEREAS, the TENTATIVE budget was approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools on April 24, 2025 and

WHEREAS, the TENTATIVE budget was advertised in the legal section of the Asbury Park Press on April 28 2025, and

WHEREAS, in the proposed FY2026 State Budget, certain districts had the opportunity to apply to the Commission of Education to increase expenditures, including an allocation of Tax Levy Incentive Aid, in order to satisfy the thoroughness and efficiency standards established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-46.

Whereas, Neptune City School District is below local fair share and spending below adequacy to be eligible to participate in this program.

Whereas, Neptune City School District is eligible to increase expenditures by \$1,450,785 and qualify for Tax Levy Incentive Aid in the amount of \$69,085.

Whereas, the Neptune City School District has been granted approval to increase expenditures based on the following reasons provide a thorough and efficient education.

WHEREAS, the FINAL BUDGET including the increase in accordance with the tax levy incentive aid was presented to the public during a public hearing held in the Woodrow Wilson School, Neptune City NJ, at 7:00PM on May 1, 2025.

### \*Adjustment for HEALTH CARE COSTS

### \*Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement 2025-2026

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$8,000.00 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$972.00 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000.00 for the 2025-2026 School Year.
