BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary to the Board of Education be authorized to submit the following tentative budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline:

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel only, an annual school year threshold of \$150 per staff member where prior Board approval shall not be required unless this annual threshold for a staff member is exceeded in a given school year and travel and related expenses not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq., but deemed by the Board of Education to be necessary and unavoidable on the approved Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; now

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.2(b), the maximum expenditure for travel for the 2014-2015 school year for all staff and board members is \$8,000 and the Board of Education approves all travel not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. as noted on the approved Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held in the Wilson School Science Room on April 29, 2014 at 7:30 PM for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the 2014-2015 Budget, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the automatic tax levy CAP adjustments for health benefits in the amounts of \$7,580. The additional funds are included in the base budget and will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefits.
